



Spring Break 2022: Round Rock Offers Family-Friendly Fun for All, Big and Small *Top 10 things to do for a perfect weekend getaway*

Round Rock, Texas (February 16, 2022) – Round Rock offers family-friendly fun perfectly situated in the heart of Central Texas. The city’s location, activities and numerous hotels make Round Rock an easy destination choice for overnight Spring Break fun.

“Round Rock offers many activities that are educational, historical, and entertaining for both kids and adults of all ages and interests,” said Nancy Yawn, Director, Round Rock Convention and Visitors Bureau. “Visitors and local-area residents are often surprised when they realize all of the activities that are available in our charming city. With so much to do, our central location and variety of hotels, Round Rock is an easy choice for a Spring Break getaway.”

Top 10 things to do during Spring Break in Round Rock include:

[Kalahari Resorts and Conventions](#) is a kid (and parent) paradise packed with excitement. The Kalahari resort in Round Rock is home to America’s Largest Indoor Waterpark with 223,000 square feet of entertainment for the whole family. The resort offers 30 waterslides, 20 pools and whirlpools, a wave pool, an adult swim-up bar, private cabanas, a waterfall, and a kiddie pool area. [Tom Foolery’s Adventure Park](#) is on-site providing more kid-friendly thrills, including amusement rides, 250+ arcade games, ropes course, climbing walls, indoor zipline, bowling, laser tag, and a mini-golf course. In addition, for those seeking a relaxing retreat, the resort’s first-class spa features body treatments, luxurious massages, skin care, nail care and hair services. The spa also includes a wet therapy room with a dry sauna and a chromotherapy steam room. Plus, a Halotherapy Salt room, whirlpool, a spa-specific outdoor pool, lounge space and a brow and lash bar.

For a unique day of pampering that includes the little ones, the [Round Rock Little Princess Spa](#) offers mommy and me specials, makeovers, relaxation treatments, manicures and more, perfect for unwinding while on vacation.

Baseball fans can step up to the plate at the [Home Run Dugout](#) located at the Dell Diamond. Home Run Dugout offers batting bays complete with a soft toss pitching machine allowing users of all skill levels to adjust settings and enable a “boost” to get a gust of wind or pull the fences in for soft hitters. The full-service restaurant and bar offers gourmet ballpark favorites.

[Old Settlers Park](#) is a 640-acre park and is considered to be the crown jewel of Round Rock’s Park System. The park offers seven playgrounds and 40 picnic areas with barbeque grills. The park’s Bright Lake includes a fishing pier and is stocked by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Fish Hatchery program with species such as Bass, Catfish, and Perch. Aviation aficionados take note that the park has a regulation remote control airplane take-off and landing strip complete with covered bleacher seating.

The [Round Rock Bass Pro Shops Outdoor World](#) is a 12,000 square foot destination — part museum, art gallery, antique store, aquarium, education, conservation, and entertainment center. You can even go underwater bowling at [Uncle Buck’s Fishbowl and Grill](#). The bowling alley is painted to look like the bottom of the ocean and has nautical fixtures throughout.

Part of the fun in Round Rock includes its entertainment and games. Visit a world of monsters and mini-golf at the [Round Rock Monster Mini Golf and Laser Tag](#) that offers an 18-hole mini-golf course, laser tag, a maze, and a video game arcade. [Altitude Trampoline Park](#) is a 23,000 square foot facility offering performance trampolines, high 9 reaction wall, rock wall, battle beam, dodgeball, foam pit, trapeze, kid’s court, main court trampolines, and a ropes course. And if a bit of a thrill is needed, [Escapology](#) offers an escape room experience where players must ‘escape’ in a specific amount of time.

If a low-key experience is on the agenda, Round Rock offers artistic activities such as the [Ceramic Lodge](#), where kids can create their own masterpiece and take a clay building class. [Board & Brush Creative Studio](#) also offers crafting activities and workshops.

Round Rock is rich with [history](#) and has well-preserved landmarks throughout the city. Travel back in time and learn what events, figures, and buildings were prominent in Round Rock’s past including the famous “round rock”, historic downtown and even the area that is now known as [Old Town](#). A [walking tour](#) of historic downtown Round Rock is also available which includes the National Register of Historic Places Commercial Historic District, historic sites and homes.

For an educational yet sweet adventure, take the [Round Rock Honey Tour](#). During this one-hour tour, visitors will learn about the history of Round Rock Honey, the process of harvesting, beekeeping, and the blending and bottling process.

The final sweet spot on the top ten things to do list is [Round Rock Donuts](#), an historic staple that has perfected the art of the donut. Located in historic downtown Round Rock, the iconic bakery has been serving handmade glazed donuts with the same recipe, and care since 1926.
